It provides an overview of the liberal studies movement, including recent trends in GLS programs. It contains information on starting a program, the kinds of students who are attracted to GLS programs, strategies for recruiting faculty and gaining administrative support, curricular models (with short descriptions of sample courses), and suggestions for marketing programs. The handbook also includes the text of the AGLSP Constitution.
